Recommended Restaurants in Jackson Hole

Casual Dining

<u>Snake River Brewing</u> AKA the Brew Pub – Locally made, award winning beer and great food at a very reasonable prices. The atmosphere is also relaxed and they have TVs for sports when applicable but are definitely not a sports bar.

<u>Pinky G's Pizzeria</u> – Great local NY style pizza. You can get it by the slice or as a whole pie (they use all NY terms too). They were on DDD (Divers, Dine-ins, and Dives) and serve the best pizza in the valley. They do not take reservations but it's worth the wait.

<u>The Wort</u> – The link goes to the Bars page but there is also a separate dining area. Both the bar and dining area serve food with slightly different menus. The bar is where we would suggest for a more local experience. They have a stage for live music, the bar is lined with \$10,000 worth of old silver dollars, and the food is good. The Wort is the oldest hotel in Jackson and should be visited even if you aren't planning on eating there.

<u>Local</u> – The newest of the listed restaurants, they also have a dining room side and bar side. The bar menu offers a build-your-own-burger menu in addition to the regular menu. They also have a good drink selection and offer a lively atmosphere.

Mid-Scale Dining

<u>Million Dollar Cowboy Steakhouse</u> – Great steak at a great location. The Million Dollar Cowboy (AKA The Cowboy) is as authentic as it gets. Upstairs in the bar they have saddles for bar seats and offer dancing on the weekends to live bands. Downstairs you can find a more upscale steakhouse with great offerings in a unique but casual atmosphere.

<u>Rendezvous Bistro</u> – Located on the farther end of town, the Bistro is where you can get frog legs, elk tartare, tuna tartare, and raw oysters. They have fried chicken on Wednesdays as their special and have a great atmosphere. They also have a good selection of beer and cocktails to choose from.

<u>Trio</u> – This is a smaller version in our opinion of the Bistro and is just off Town Square. They have great local fare along with a local beef tartare from Lockhart Cattle, which is just a few miles south of town. They also offer Bison Tenderloin as an entrée and for those who haven't had bison, its like cow but 10x better.at least.

<u>Piste Bistro</u> – This is the more expensive restaurant of the list and located furthest away but completely worth it for those who drive. Dinner is only served Thursday, Friday, and Saturday so it would really only work for people coming early or staying overnight on Thursday but we wanted to list it because it's amazing and also offers lunch. Piste is located at Jackson Hole Mountain Resort, on top of the gondola. You ride for about 12 minutes to 9,095' where the restaurant resides. Your view is overlooking the valley, and the food is as good as it gets.

Other

Dessert: <u>CoCo Love</u> – The website isn't actually about the store but rather the master chocolatier who founded and owns coco love. Oscar Ortega is one of two master chocolatiers in the entire US, and he lives and works in Jackson. The desserts are phenomenal as are the chocolates they serve. Anyone who goes will not be disappointed. It is located across from the main entrance to the Wort Hotel.

Pastries: <u>Persephone Bakery</u> – Words won't do it justice, you would be committing a crime against yourself if you don't go there. Seriously. Go.
