MassDEP Challenges

- Thousands of facilities and activities to track, inspect, and monitor; with a 29% reduction in FTE's for inspecting and tracking compliance
- Slowed permit time to decision due to incomplete applications
- Thousands of reports submitted via paper
- Public records requests
- 100+ separate Data Systems, making it difficult to share data and meet evolving requirements






Our Path Forward?

EIPAS Design Tenets

- 1. Team members trained in Agile
- Projects designed to be modular and iterative and have production ready code quickly
- 3. Applications are designed to use **sharable**, **extensible** components
- 4. Flexibility in design to reflect changes in administration goals or regulation changes
- 5. Integrated Business Technology Platform enables **data sharing** between legacy and new systems faster than if we tried to redesign all our legacy systems

- Work collaboratively to transform systems, processes, and programs in smart, secure, and affordable ways.
- Enable consumers of environmental data to access highquality digital environmental information and services across organizational boundaries.
- Leverage technology for faster data sharing and provide better predictive versus reactive environmental management approaches.

- Customer-Centric Allow customers to shape, share and consume information, whenever and however they want it.
- Information-Centric Move from managing
 "documents" to managing discrete pieces of open data
 and content which can be presented in the way that is
 most useful for the consumer.
- Shared Platforms Reduce costs, streamline development, apply consistent standards, and ensure consistency in how we create and deliver information.
