## Breakout Option #1: ECOS Oil & Gas Caucus (O&GC) on Methane Moves (open to all)

As U.S. EPA takes first steps toward developing a rule to reduce methane from new and existing sources in the oil and natural gas industry, many states are already implementing their own regulatory and innovative approaches. Industry players are taking voluntary actions, and one NGO has launched work on an ambitious public satellite tool to locate and measure sources of methane pollution. This session will address the state of play and flexibilities needed to create a clearer regulatory landscape.
