

Opportunity to get the impossible projects done









ARPA

- \$11.5 million homeowner well and septic repair
- \$75 million for septic, straight pipe, and collection system repairs
- \$290 million to three cities for CSO projects
- \$100 million for nutrient reduction projects and two specific localities
- \$100 million for small and disadvantaged waterworks
- \$68.6 million to specific wastewater projects

BIL

- Clean Water SRF
 - \$250 million additional over 5 years
 - Increased additional subsidization
 - Emerging contaminants
 - Technical assistance
- Drinking Water SRF
 - \$500 million additional over 5 years
 - Emerging contaminants
 - Lead service line replacements

State Appropriations

- \$256.5 million to the Virginia Natural Resources Commitment Fund
 - Agricultural BestManagement Practices
 - \$21 million for technical assistance
- Multi-year SRF State Match for BIL incremental dollars



Overarching Principles

Virginia General Assembly:

Access to clean, potable water in amounts that will ensure an acceptable standard of living is a necessary human right

It is the policy of the Commonwealth to prioritize universal access to wastewater treatment that protects public health and the environment and supports local economic growth and stability
