SUPERFUND REMEDIAL PROGRAM

Overview

- **\$3.5 Billion** invested in EPA's Superfund Remedial program to:
 - 49 Superfund National Priority List (NPL) sites with backlogged remedial construction projects; and
 - Accelerate cleanup work at ongoing NPL sites.
- No required state cost share for funds from Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT & RECYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE

Overview

- \$375 million for new solid waste management and recycling efforts.
 - \$275 million for Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling (SWIFR) grant program;
 - \$75 million for Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Education and Outreach grant program; and
 - \$25 million for battery collection best practices and a voluntary labeling guideline program.
