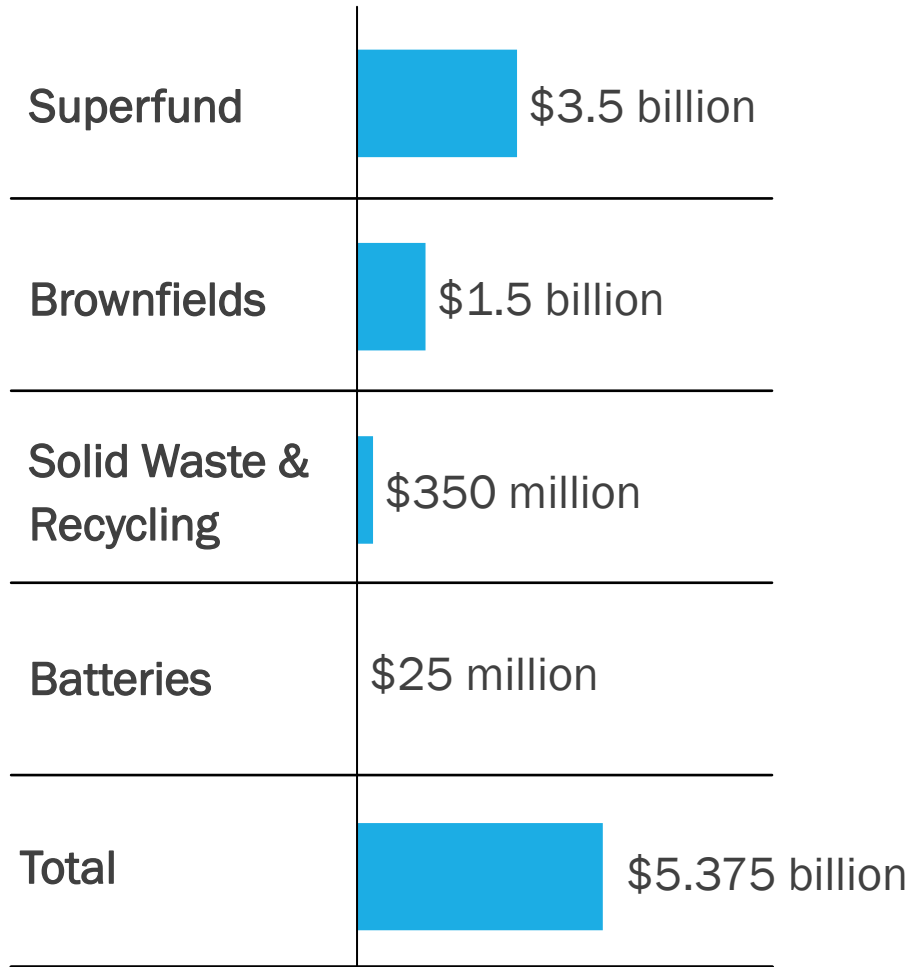

OVERVIEW OF INVESTMENTS FROM BIPARTISAN INFRASTRUCTURE LAW (BIL)

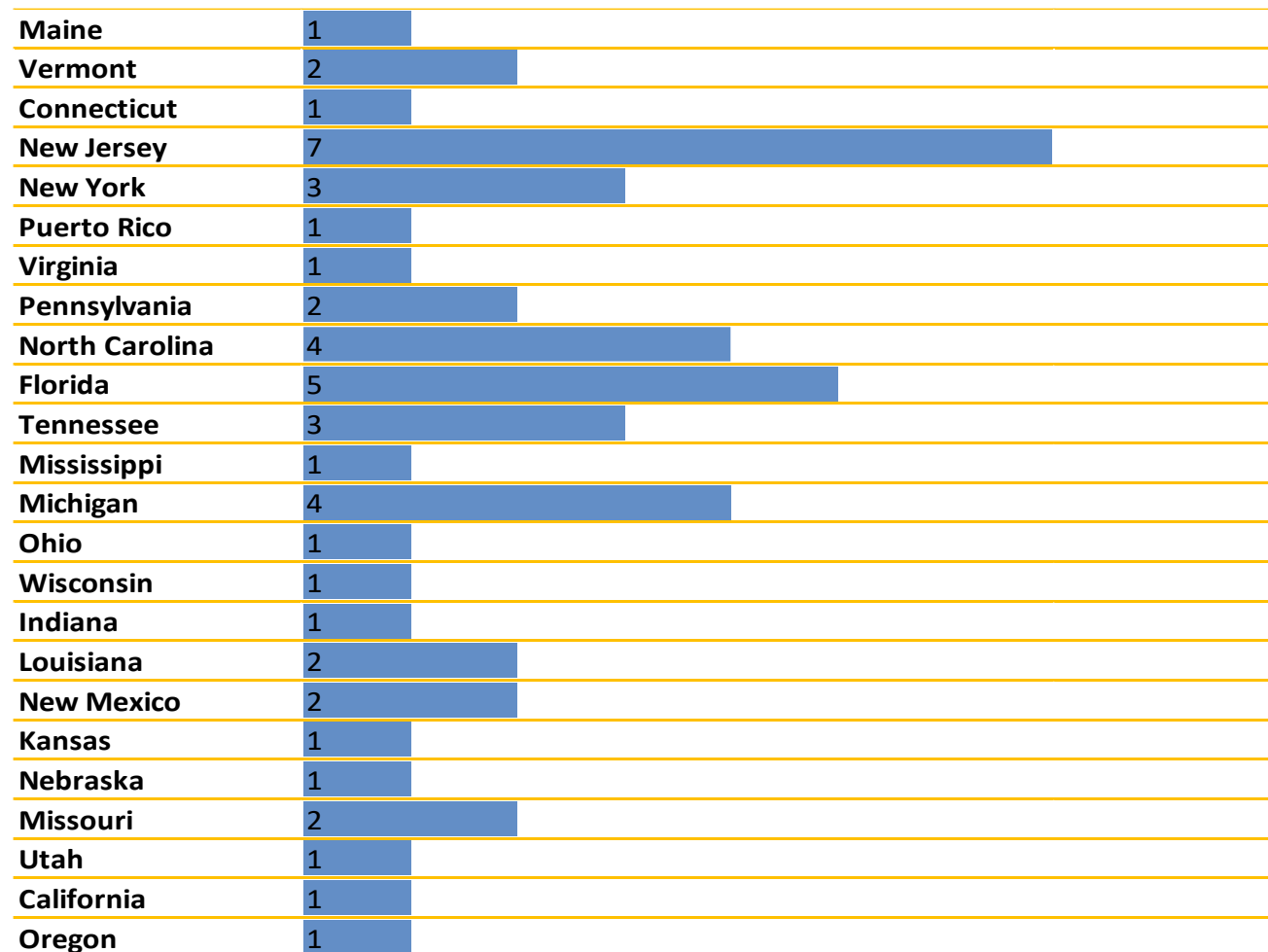

SUPERFUND REMEDIAL PROGRAM

Overview

- **\$3.5 Billion** invested in EPA's Superfund Remedial program to:
 - **49 Superfund National Priority List (NPL) sites** with backlogged remedial construction projects; and
 - **Accelerate** cleanup work at ongoing NPL sites.
- No required state cost share for funds from Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT & RECYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE

Overview

- **\$375 million** for new solid waste management and recycling efforts.
 - **\$275 million** for Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling (SWIFR) grant program;
 - **\$75 million** for Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Education and Outreach grant program; and
 - **\$25 million** for battery collection best practices and a voluntary labeling guideline program.
