### Road to INC on Plastic Pollution

- Growing recognition of plastic pollution as a global problem requiring international cooperation.
- Plastic pollution is priority issue in several international fora.
- March 2022, UNEA resolution 5/14, End plastic pollution: Towards an international legally binding instrument, launched negotiations on a global agreement on plastic pollution.





## **Overview of INC**

- Intergovernmental negotiating committee (INC) launched in second half of 2022 with the goal of completing text by end of 2024.
- The scope of the instrument is specified as "plastic pollution, including in the marine environment".
- Countries agreed on a open-ended working group preparatory meeting and five sessions of the INC.
- Overarching outcomes of INC-1:
  - Strong interest from countries to move to discussions on the details of potential elements of the global agreement.

## **Expectations for INC-2**

- INC-2 will be May 29 June 2 in Paris.
- Potential for continued procedural disruptions at INC-2.
- Discussion of potential options document prepared by Secretariat.
  - Expected to be shared online in mid-April.

## U.S. Approach to the Global Agreement

- The United States is committed to negotiating an ambitious, innovative, and country-driven global agreement.
- We need a global agreement that will facilitate rapid and meaningful progress.
- The agreement should include mechanisms to provide transparency, reporting, and monitoring of progress.

## U.S. Approach to the Global Agreement

- Objective: Protect human health and the environment from plastic pollution.
- Envision ambitious provisions –including obligations, commitments, and voluntary approaches designed to prevent and reduce the amount of plastic entering the environment.
- Promote the sustainable production and consumption of plastic, increase plastic circularity, and strengthen the management of plastic waste.
- Country-driven national action plans address plastic pollution across the lifecycle of plastic.
- National reporting is critical.



### Role of Partners and Stakeholders

- We also see a strong complementary role for partners and stakeholders by highlighting their actions to combat plastic pollution in a multistakeholder action agenda.
- Highlight the successes and best practices learned by innovative subnational government actions.
- National governments cannot solve this problem alone.
