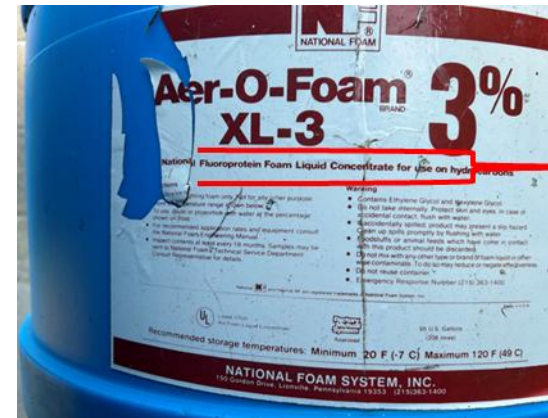

AFFF Collection

- 104 fire departments, 1 airport participated
- 1,060 containers of Class B foam collected
- Total of 9,924 gallons
- Some foams not accepted

Restricts the use of PFAS in certain consumer products



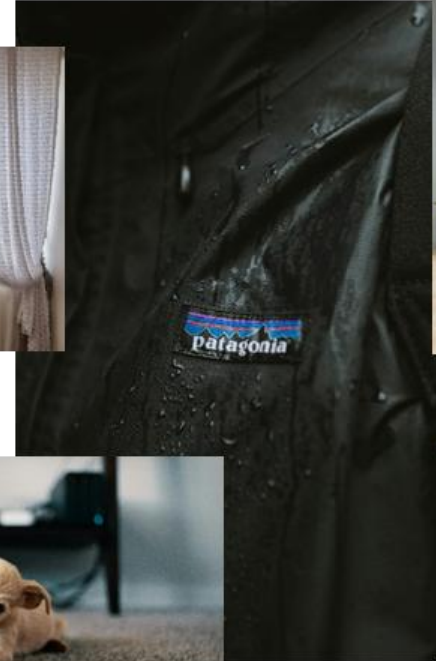
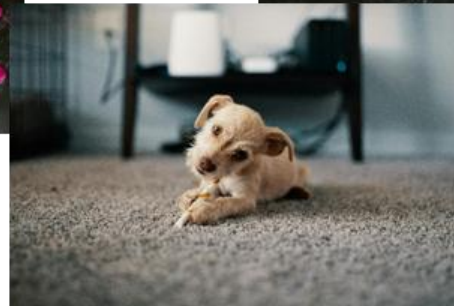
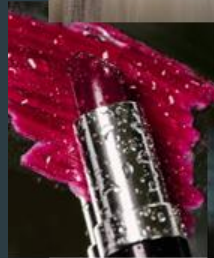
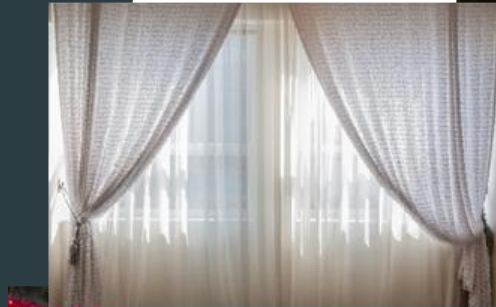
